This Toastmasters train is marching! Engines running, cylinders firing. Our membership is achieving goals and milestones... together!

The District remains on track for achieving its planned PQD strategic goals!

- Incremental increase of club officer training to 2.5 hours in 2nd round and ready to land at a new standard of 3 hours in June 2024.
- Increase club officer attendance from 58% average. In first round we achieved 70% trained. In second round we achieved 60%. When considering credit hour increase and two part ZOOM session model change great to see!
- Increase attendance at TLI events. Fall TLI achieved 90 and Winter TLI had 50 in attendance!
- Supporting distinguished club point achievements. Close to 40 clubs gained one point for 4 of 7 officers trained for both 1st & 2nd round.

Our training surveys report 8.5/10 satisfaction for trainer quality and or the content delivered! A very respectable numbers that supports the dedication, hard work and quality from well over 30+ volunteers when accounting for the ZOOM training sessions and TLI events!

Here is the Points system again -

- 1 point per 13+ members club visit,
- 2 points per 8 12 members club visit and
- 3 points per 1 7 members club visit.

To have your points awarded have the President or VPE email gavel@district64.ca and let them know

- 1. Your name,
- 2. Your home club,
- 3. How many members are in the club (most important to include).

Prizes will be awarded to the top 3 toastmasters who have the most points.
