Chartered as Monarch Life Speakers Forum on July 1, 1976, it was District 64's first corporate club. Less than 10 years later, the club was floundering - no longer supported by Monarch Life which had be taken over by North American Life.

The club changed it's name to Broadway Speakers Forum as it still met on that Street. In 1985, it had very low membership and switched meeting times from noon to early morning.

The duo of Gord McIlroy and Arnold Mickelson had a goal of a morning club for each day of the week and Broadway Speakers was one of those clubs. (Gord and Arnold shared the Eric Stuhlmueller Memorial Award in 1991-1992.)

The name changed again in the 90's to reflect that it no longer met on Broadway. The club became Downtown Winnipeg Toastmasters. Today, the club members, ranging from beginners to experts, come from diverse backgrounds.

On Wednesday, January 22, 2025 the club will be holding this year's Table Topics contest. Guests welcome.


